He shared that for the past two years, before the church became involved, he felt as though he was “two meters underground”—as if he were already dead. Now, he is attending church. He told Larry that he and God are talking about the future.

There is a lady from the church who stops by and brings him food from time to time. Larry shared with Nândor that what he is experiencing is God's love—the most powerful thing in the universe.
